Allow me space in your paper to ad-
dress:

THE VOTERS OF CHRISTIANSTED
COUNTRY DISTRICT.

As a candidate for your suffrage, at
the coming election, it is but right that
you should at least be informed of my
position on what I sincerely believe to be
needed, legislation, affecting our island's
Political and Economic existence.

1st. I regret the want of and there
should be a better system for nominating
candidates to our legislature (Colonial
Council): A system wherein the People
through their selected representatives in
convention assembled, can by a majority
vote select (choose) from among them-
selves the ones by them deemed most
competent and willing to serve their in-
terests.

2nd. There should be a legislature,
bicameral in composition, that is compos-
ed of two houses, and possessed of fuller
and more independent powers and scope.

3rd By petitioning the Congress of
the United States to give these islands a
Permanent Organic Act, similar to Porto
Rico, the Philippine Islands, Hawaii and
Alaska, no better, nor yet not any worse,
