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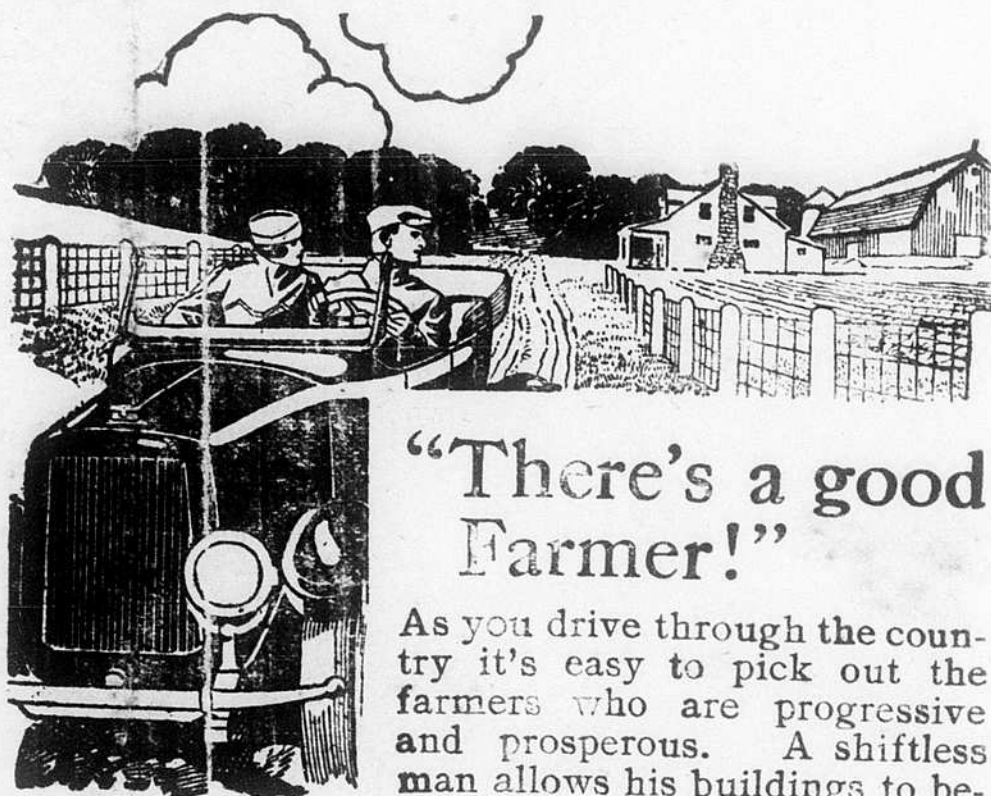
TELEGRAMS

ST. CROIX STATION.

Halifax, N. S., 18th--Yesterday morning the Prince of Wales arrived at Halifax on board the cruiser "Dragon" which bore him from St. John arrived here at 10.50 o'clock and fifteen minutes later he boarded H. M. S. "Renown" as the "Dragon" which was escorted by the Dauntless passed by. Royal salutes of 21 guns were fired from the Citadel and from the Italian battleship "Conte di Cavour" which came to convey greetings from Boston and the King of Italy to the heir apparent of the British throne. In the evening he gave a dinner upon the battleship to which were invited the Lieutenant Governor Sir Robert Borden, Premier George Murray and other personages of note. The Prince will land and receive an official welcome this morning.

Washington, Aug. 18th.--Anxiety is felt here over the lack of news concerning arrival of the giant airplane Goliath at Dakar the airplane was last reported on Saturday morning at 3.10 o'clock passing over Port Gienne 50 miles from Dakar, at the time the machine had accomplished the worst part of the journey from Megador to Dakir.

Berlin, Aug. 17th.--The New German constitution which was passed by the National Assembly after a months debate and which became effective this week, is divided into two main parts namely the composition and the ties of the Empire and the basis, rights and duties of a German. The first part consists of seven sections and the second of five, the subdivisions of first part are: Empire and individual States, the Reichstag, the Imperial President, Imperial Govt., Imperi-



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al Council, Imperial legislation, and Imperial Administration of Justice, those of the second part are: The individual community of live, religion, and religious

societies, education and schools, and economic life the concluding part of the constitution bears the title of transition relations.
