Lieutenant Robert O'Hagan, Supply Corps, U. S. Nav., at his own request has been relieved by Governor Oman today from duty as Despatching Secretary in St. Croix. Lieutenant Commander Frederick B. Colby, Supply Corps, U. S. Navy, will temporarily perform such duty.

As result of the Court of Inquiry recently convened to enquire into the unlawful discharge of firearms in St. Thomas on New Year's Eve Governor Oman has today ordered a general court martial to meet next Monday to try Ensign John Schroeder, U. S. Navy, upon a charge alleging his participation in the matter. What further action will be taken has not been determined at this time.

Lieutenant Eugene L. Walter, Dental Corps, U.S. Navy, has been ordered from the Naval Hospital, New York, to duty at the Naval Station, St. Thomas as the relief of Lieutenant Conrad H. Nelson, Dental Corps, U. S. Navy.

WASHINGTON: Resolution declaring that the action of Rear Admiral Sims in making public official instruction of the most confidential character effecting international relations deserved the condemnation of all Americans was introduced in Senate this afternoon by Sena-
