TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Paris, March 24th.—M. Poincare on Saturday scored another victory in his movement to stabilize the nation's finances and restore economic equilibrium in France, when both the Senate and the Chamber of Deputies passed the Government's taxation and fiscal reform bill. The vote in the Senate was 146 to 12 in favour of the bill. The fiscal bill is expected to bring to the Treasury and additional 6,323,000,000 francs through increased taxation yearly and effect one million in economies. The bill was presented to the Senate for final vote by M. Poincare and Minister of Finance Da Lasteyrie. It was understood on good authority that the Government's next fiscal move in its efforts to improve France's financial situation will be to present a plan for the consolidation of a national floating debt, about eighty billions, before Parliament dissolves for the general elections.

Paris, March 24th.—A conference at London between Mr. Mac Donald and Count De Staulaire, the French Ambassador, at which questions relating to the reparations, the palatinate, the reparation experts findings and security for France were discussed in their broader outlines, developed a particularly cordial atmosphere. This was the only comment the Foreign Office would make upon the meeting.

Washington, March 24th.—Government Counsel in the oil cases, on returning to Washington today, announced that presentation of criminal evidence in the cases would be started about April 10th before a special District of Columbia Grand Jury.
