French Government Requests Bank

TIGHTEN CREDIT
STOP SPECULATORS
REDOUBLE CAUTION

PLAN IS NOT TO CUT OFF, BUT TO RATION LOANS—PRICE DROP DUE TO INITIATIVE OF UNITED STATES AND LOWERED COST OF RAW MATERIALS.

PARIS, Nov. 23.—The French Government has passed the word to the banks to tighten up on credits, according to the "Il Transigeant" to day, and as a result the cost of living in France already has ceased its upward flight, if it is not actually starting downward.

The Government's word to the banks, the newspaper says, was not to cut off credits but to ration them, supporting honest firms in temporary need, but denying further credit to speculators for whom new loans would be only an encouragement to maintain high prices.

George Robineau, Governor of the Bank of France, is quoted as saying the banks are acting with redoubled caution and that it is certain that reductions are on the way by a slow downward curve.
