for the 4th Ordinary Meeting of the Colonial Council for St. Croix, MONDAY, December 15, 1919, at one o'clock p. m.

1. Colonial Council Bill No. 17.
Additional Money Bill to the Budget for the Municipality of St. Croix for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1920, introduced by 2nd Appointed Member (Noll)—Increases in salaries to effect a re-organization of the Municipal Police Force.
2. Colonial Council Bill No. 18.
Additional Money Bill to the Budget for the Municipality of St. Croix for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1920, granting Pres. 10,000.00 to be expended during the period from January 1, 1920 to June 30, 1920 inclusive for the establishing and maintaining of a Government Attorney's Office.
3. Colonial Council Bill No. 19.

Additional Money Bill to the Budget for the Municipality of St. Croix for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1920, introduced by 2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) for the purchase of 1 Hearse not to exceed Francs 500.00.

Resolution assigning additional land to the Leper Asylum. Introduced by 3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch).
