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Tabernacle, which we are now completing, and which he greatly desired to see finished, for he had spent many hours in earnest prayer for funds to carry on the work on that building, and gave many directions to the workmen who were doing the work, even on his sick bed. And, oh, how we longed to have him raised up again, for future ministry, particularly in his special line—a teacher of God's Word, it seems as though we could not spare him, for with the vision before us of a school for Scriptural Knowledge, we knew of no one better fitted to fill the place of a "Teacher" than he; and yet God took him. Yes, his labours are over and he is at rest, but his works will surely follow him, and we know he will be among the number who will have a "Crown of joy and rejoicing in the presence of the Lord," for there will be many redeemed souls to greet him as their Spiritual Father in that glorious resurrection morning, when "the dead in Christ shall rise first, and we, who are alive—shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air."

As I wrote the above, my heart cry was, "Come, Lord Jesus, come quickly," for there is such a sense of lonesomeness upon me; and such a shrink to face the future of this work without the help of one who was so efficient, so talented; he always seemed to know just what to do, could meet the business men of the world in such a capable manner, and carry things through to a finish, and oh how insufficient we feel to fill his place; but the Lord has given us this promise: "As I was with Moses, so I will be with thee: I will not fail thee, nor forsake thee." "Be Strong and of a good courage," Joshua 1: 5, 6, and so we are trusting Him for "sufficient grace," and for "His Strength to be made perfect in our weakness" as we continue our ministry, and keep the doors open in this part of God's vineyard until Jesus comes, or we, too, hear the call "Come up higher," and "depart to be with Christ which is far better." "Brethren pray for us."—Faith, June 1924.
