## TELEGRAMS.

### ST. CROIX STATION.

London, July 9th.--The consequences of the coal strike are shown in the further huge decrease in British trade for June. Imports are down eighty two million pounds sterling, compared with June 1920 and exports have decreased seventy eight million pounds sterling. Cotton imports are less by eleven millions, wool by seven millions, flour and grain by four millions, and other food stuffs and drinks are down nine millions. Coal exports decreased by eight million pounds sterling. Iron and steel by eight and three quarter millions cotton manufactures by twenty-six millions.

London, July 8th.--The total expenses of the League of Nations for the current year have been 21,000,000 gold francs, approximately equivalent of £860,000 and are apportioned among forty-eight members. Mr. Balfour informed the House of Commons.
