for the 5th Ordinary Meeting of the Colonial Council for St. Croix, MONDAY, March 1, 1920, at one o'clock p. m.

1. Colonial Council Bill No. 23.
Resolution authorizing the Governor to increase amounts budgetted for the current fiscal year by a percentage not to exceed that by which the rates of exchange for the current fiscal year exceed the normal rate. Introduced by Government.
