ST. CROIX STATION.

St. Johns, N. F. June 29th—Field Marshal Earl Haig arrived here today to unveil the memorial of the Newfoundland sailors and soldiers killed during the war. The General was accompanied by Lady Haig, Colonel Talbot, Captain Donald Simpson and Captain Gordon, High Commissioner for Newfoundland in Great Britain. Special memorial services were held in all the city churches today. Earl and Lady Haig accompanied Governor and Lady Allardyce to the Anglican Cathedral. The formal unveiling of the memorial takes place on Tuesday. The Field Marshal will spend several days in St. Johns and will be the centre of special demonstrations and sporting events, including a spectacular regatta on Quidi-Vidi Lake, scheduled for Wednesday. Two British warships, two United States Coast Guard ships and one French warship are in port to take part in the events arranged in connection with Earl Haig's visit.

Athens, June 26th.—With more than three quarters of the officers of the Greek Navy in mutiny, the British Mediterranean Fleet has arrived at New Pualaron, port of Athens. Admiral D. Brock visited the President soon after the war craft dropped anchor on Friday and an elaborate social programme was arranged in honour of the visiting craft. Meanwhile there have been no further mutiny developments.
