LOCAL.

We take a lively interest in the mails and the mail service because we feel that for some reason or other we never get it early enough via Frederiksted which we do not be-

lieve to be any fault on the postmaster there, and this is why we took pains to see how it would work here yesterday. Unfortunately the public, mostly children, behaved so abominably that general delivery had to be suspended here yesterday afternoon. The postmaster asks to mention that in view of the fact that through their conduct numerous patrons are obstructed and work held up, mail will be delivered to children at the discretion of the Postmaster only upon written order from the parties for whom they call.
