OFFICIAL NEWS.

The postmaster has received a communication from Mr. Fred L. Button, Attorney at Law, 235 Bacon Building, Oakland, Cal., asking his help in finding a correspondent in St. Croix who is interested in the collection of shells, both marine and land, who would be willing and able to furnish shells which Mr. But-

ton is wanting, and for which he offers a generous exchange from his own large collection of shells including many rare specimens. Mr. Button is at present particularly interested in the "Cowries" (cypraea) and the so called coffee-beans (trivia) and would like fine specimens of any of these from the West Indies. A circular relating to Mr. Button's collection of the mollusca sent to the postmaster, may be had by interested parties.

The Post Office Department advises that the provisions of paragraph 2 (b), section 595, Postal Laws and Regulations, under which "all mail, whatever its class, addressed to persons in the United States service (civil, military, or naval), serving in the United States or any of its possessions, or en route to or from the United States or any of its possessions, whose change of address is caused by official orders, shall be transmitted as rapidly as possible until it reaches the addressee; * * * and no additional postage shall be required therefor," do not apply to second, third and fourth-class matter (parcel post) addressed to a member of the family of a person in the United States service, such mail to be forwarded as otherwise provided by the regulations.
