New London, June 25th. -Harvard sprung a surprise in the annual regatta with Yale by easily winning the four mile varsity race by six lengths.

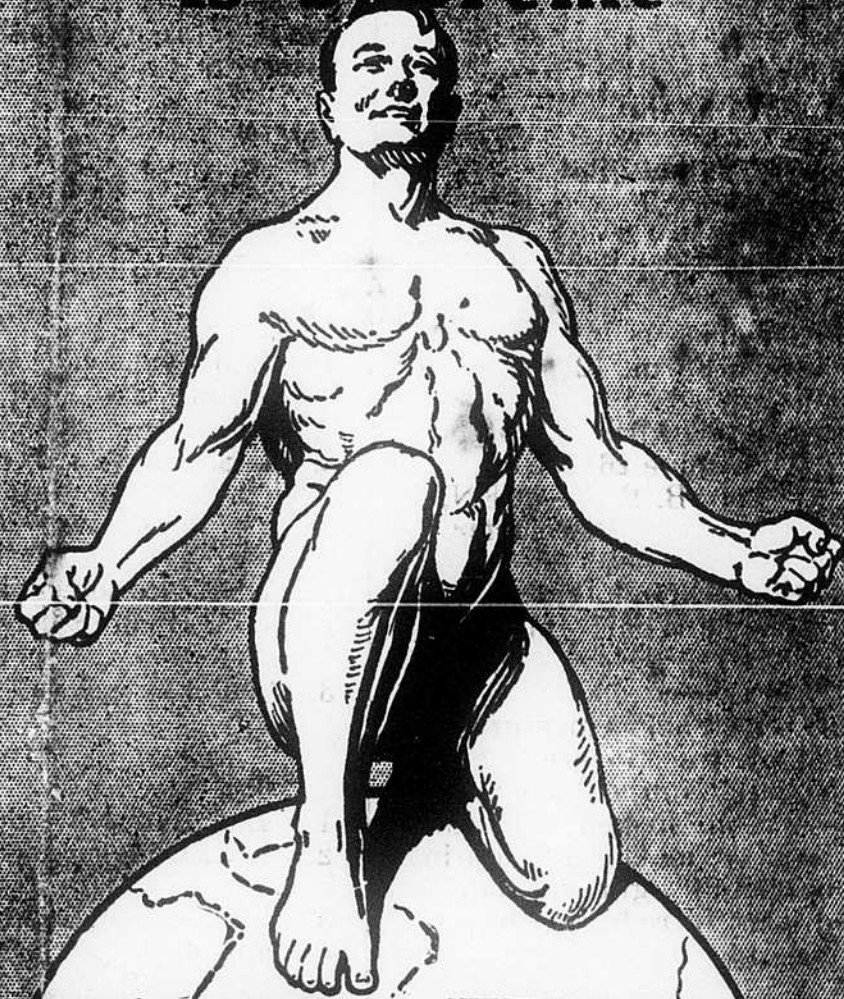

He said that the British Govt. was of that feeling but would make no statement on the treaty situation at the present time. He said however that there had been no decision whatever with respect to renewing or allowing the treaty automatically to remain in force for a year the document provides.
