TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Paris, March 23rd.—Advices from Berlin state that complete calm prevails in that city last night and this morning, but no newspapers are yet appearing. An official inquiry concerning the leaders of the recent coup d'état shows that immediately after its accomplishment the authors fled. Warrants have been issued for the arrest of General Knapp, Herr Von Jagow, Major Pabst, Colonel Bauer, Genl. Ludendorff and others. Ministers Giesberg and Bauer have left for the Ruhr Basin, with authority from the Govt. to negotiate with the workmen.

Paris, March 23rd.—In the further hearing of the Caillaux case, M. Augagneur, who was a member of the Caillaux Ministry, as Minister of Marine, at the time of the Agadir incident, stated that the attitude of M. Caillaux was correct.

Paris, March 23rd.—By a vote of 374 to 139 the Chamber of Deputies has passed a law granting to each Senator and Deputy a special monthly indemnity of one thousand francs from the 1st Feb., for expenses of residence, correspondence and other expenditures connected with their legislative duties.

Paris, March 23rd.—M. Millerand presided yesterday at a conference of the Ambassadors at which Marshal Foch assisted, and heard the reports of the military experts on the situation in Germany.

Paris, March 23rd.—Advices from Rome state that M. Douget, the Minister plenipotentiary, who, together with the Secretary of the Holy See, has been appointed to prepare the bases for the resumption of relations between France and the Vatican, has arrived there and been received by Cardinal Gasparri.

Havre, March 23rd.—The s. s. "Leopoldina", the former German Liner "Blucher", has arrived here from New York with 800 passengers on board.

Paris, March 23rd.—Following a note which the German Govt. addressed recently to the Supreme Council, asking for authority to send fresh military forces to the Ruhr Basin, German officers have arrived in Paris and laid the proposal before the Allies. It is believed that the Reich Govt. will be authorized to send one hundred thousand men to the Ruhr, as a police force.

Algiers, March 23rd.—The aviator, M. Voillemin, reached Timbuctoo on the 18th and left for Moite on the 21st, where he arrived the same day. He ex-
