PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

[Continued from yesterday's Avis.]

4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I fully endorse the words of the last speaker. There is an old saying that "it was the last straw that broke the camel's back". This Resolution seems to be the last move to deprive the Municipality of its rights and kill the usefulness of the Municipal Committee.

The Naval Government should bear in mind that they are administering a civil body whose legislative body is created to protect the interest of the people.

Our last Governor asked this Council to vote away several of our rights embodied in the By-laws of the Municipal Committee and that was done in order to try to work in harmony with Government for the general benefit of the island. The benefits so far are not noticeable. I advise the Council to vote against this Resolution.

Despatching Secretary (O'Hagan) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I think the Honorable 4th. Appointed Member is laboring under a misapprehension as regards the form of Government. This is

not a Naval form of Government, but is a Civil form of Government. The President has the power to appoint a Governor for these islands, and he may appoint a Naval Officer, but the mere fact of appointing a Naval Officer does not change the form of Government.

As regards this Resolution, it is merely to take care of one building, to rent it for five dollars per month, and I don't think it will take away any power from the Municipal Committee or the Council; and as stated, the only two conditions this Resolution will take care of is the house at Peter's Farm and the Post Office.

4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I understand the Honorable Despatching Secretary to say that this Resolution is only for a specific purpose; it should be taken into consideration that we are legislating for the future as well as the present. Why could not this question of renting the municipal properties be brought before the Municipal Committee by Government for discussion and recommendation as was done in the past? To advise with Government on such questions where the municipality's interests are concerned is what this body was created for, but some one seems to be interested in blocking its usefulness.

2nd Member for Frederiksted Country District (M. M. Skeoch) concurred in the remarks made by 4th. Appointed Member (Blackwood).

The Chairman then put to the vote whether the Resolution should be furthered.

1 member voted for; 10 against.

The Chairman remarked: The Resolution is lost.
