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TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Washington, Feb. 13th.—Developments in the oil scandal tumbled over each other rapidly today and went so far afield that when night came the National Capital had not recovered from the shock.

Berlin, Feb. 13th.—Bloody fighting has broken out between Separatists and Germans loyal to a palatinate according to despatches here today. Herr Schwab, Separatist Leader, was lynched by a mob of infuriated loyal Germans and set on fire. Maddened mobs of infuriated citizens continued to hunt down Separatists throughout Pirmasens today. Wherever ferreted out, the Separatists were killed, or badly beaten. Despatches received here up to noon said a total of 49 were known to be dead at that hour. The Separatists had lost 28 killed and the citizens 21. Trouble began late yesterday, when citizens of Pirmasens, reinforced by the Fire Department, started a concerted attack on the Separatists who rallied and fired heavy volleys, wounding many of the attackers, who were armed with rifles, picks and axes. The Separatists barricaded themselves in the City Hall, a grim fortress like an old castle. They held off the attacks until the citizens heavily reinforced with city guards renewed the attack with benzine to start fire. Agonizing appeals for mercy came from the trapped Separatists as the flames surrounded them. Desperate hand to hand fighting in the midst of the flames ensued.
