REVISED CONVERSION RATES FOR INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDERS, EFFECTIVE AUG. 15, 1920.

Because of the decided and long-continued depreciation of the currency of certain European countries as compared with the United States dollar, the Postmaster General has ordered that on and after August 15, and until further notice, in issuing money orders, the money of the United States shall be converted in accordance with the following schedule:

GREAT BRITAIN.....	£1	= \$4
NETHERLANDS.....	1 florin	= 38 cents
SWEDEN.....	1 krone	= 24 cents
DENMARK.....	1 krone	= 20 cents
NORWAY.....	1 krone	= 20 cents
FRANCE.....	\$1	= 10.30 francs
BELGIUM.....	\$1	= 10.30 francs
ITALY.....	\$1	= 10.30 francs

DISCONTINUANCE OF HOLIDAY SERVICE, CHRISTIANSTED - FREDERIKSTED, EFFECTIVE AT ONCE.
