TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London, April 5th.—The Labour Party intends to try and obtain United States cooperation with Great Britain and other nations in solving World problems, said, Mr. J. Ramsay Mac Donald in a speech at Porthcawl, Wales. Mr. Mac Donald referred to the recent conferences between French, Belgian, Italian and British labour parliamentarians in Paris, in consequence of which they were much nearer an agreement on a solution to the Ruhr difficulties than three weeks ago. For a solution of World problems, however, labour wanted the United States to come in, but it would never get that country if it only addressed it through Governments. Labour accordingly was going to try its hand at parliamentary cooperation in the United States and see whether, by getting in physical contact with United States Senators, and Representatives, it could lay the foundation for cooperation, so that the United States, Great Britain and other powers might work out a great European policy.

Cairo, April 5th.—It is understood that the arrangements with the Egyptian Government relative to excavation at Tutankhamen's tomb will not be affected by the death of the Earl of Carnarvon. Apparently a contract was made in the name of Howard Carter, who was associated with the Earl in the work.

New York, April 5th.—It was reported here today that the Canadian Pacific Railway plans to pay off a \$52,000,000 issue of six per cent notes certificated in July. This is about seven months in advance of the maturity date.
