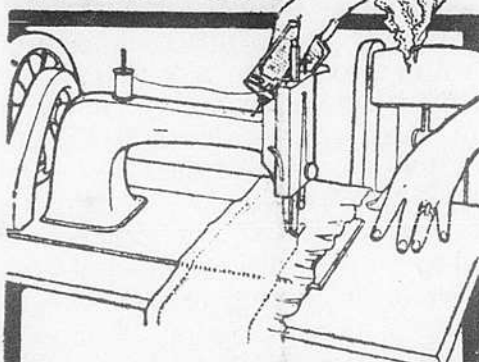

London, Aug. 31st.—By defeating Surrey by 6 wickets, Middlesex retains the county cricket championship of England. The game was hard-fought throughout

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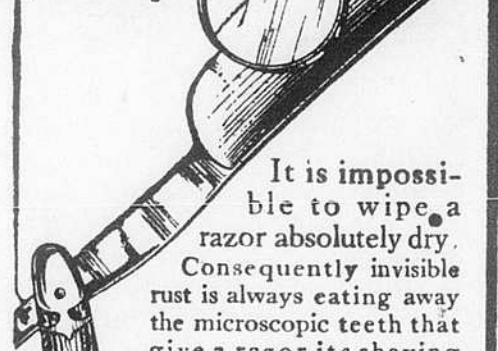

London, Aug. 31st.—A Reuter despatch from Parampra, India, reports that detachments of the Leinster regiment and special police, who relieved Mallapurans beleaguered garrison, had the fiercest prolonged fighting with large bodies of rebel Moplahs outside Pukkar-tur. The enemy were armed with looted carbines, sporting-rifles, swords and jack-knives. The Moplahs showed their traditional ferocity and eagerness for death, fighting continuously and desperately for five hours before they were beaten off. Martial law has been proclaimed in the five sub-districts of the Malabar district.

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
