PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

At one o'clock p. m. Monday, May 10, 1920, the Colonial Council of St. Croix held an extraordinary meeting at the Council Hall in Christiansted convened by request of Government.

The following members were present: The Chairman (Merwin), A. E. Stake-mann, D. Noll, Thos. Ramsay, K. Henderson, A. J. Blackwood, W. S. Abramson, F. Lunney, W. H. MacKay, D. C. Canegata, W. L. Penheny, F. Coulter, G. B. Fleming and D. S. Armstrong.

2nd Member for Frederiksted Country District [M. M. Skeoch] sent in an ex-

cuse of his inability to attend the meeting. Furthermore were absent, 3rd Member for Frederiksted Country District (Nordby), and 1st Member for said District [Andersen], and 3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt W. Skeoch).

His Excellency the Governor Admiral Oman, Despatching Secretary [Commander Colby] and Captain White attended the meeting.

After prayers had been said the Chairman remarked: Honorable members the proceedings of the last meeting of the Council have been duly published in the "St Croix Avis" as customary and if there is no objection I will consider same tacitly adopted.

There being no objection the Chairman declared the minutes as published tacitly adopted.

The Chairman then read the following communications received since the last meeting:

1. Letter From Government of May 1, 1920 with regard to Boards, Commissions and Committees.

2. Letter from Government of May 8, 1920 forwarding Draft of Ordinance in connection with the establishment of libraries in the Island.

The Chairman then remarked: We will now proceed to Item 1 of the Order of the Day.

Item 1.

ORDER OF THE DAY

Colonial Council Bill No. 29.

Continuation of 2nd Discussion on Colonial Council Bill No. 29, Draft of an Ordinance, introduced by Government, establishing and declaring the organization of the Judiciary and Educational Departments of the Virgin Islands of the United States etc.

1st Member for Christiansted Country District (Stakemann) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I would like to ask if we can get certain elucidations in regard to certain question. At the last meeting it was said that the bill which I introduced regarding the employment of employees, if passed would limit the power of the Governor; on the strength of that statement I withdrew the bill; of course I am getting old and my brain may not be as good as it was years ago, nevertheless, if that bill was in conflict with the Organic Act, how then, can it be proposed in the measure before us that the Governor will have power to appoint a judge and the judge can appoint his clerks? That seems more in favor of limiting the power of the Governor. Is this measure considered more compatible than the bill which I introduced? That's the question I would like to get elucidations on.
