CONCLUSIONS OF LAW.

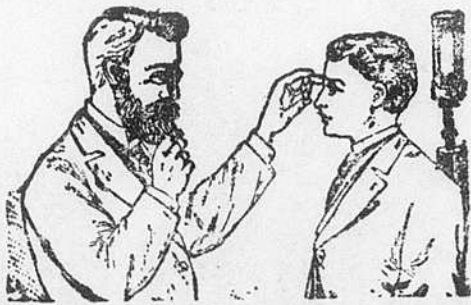
1. THE PLAINTIFF, IS A TENANT AT WILL.
