PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

Fourth Council, Second Session, 1924-1925

At 1:30 o'clock p. m. Monday, June 2,
1924, the Colonial Council of St. Croix
held an extraordinary meeting in the
Colonial Council Hall in Christiansted
(Convened by request of Government).

Present: The Acting Chairman (Robt.
L. Merwin), D. C. Canegata, A. J. Black-
wood, Thos. Ramsay, Robt. W. Skeoch,
F. Andersen, Holger Jessen, D. Hamil-
ton Jackson, H. Berg, W. S. Abramson,
D. S. Armstrong, Joseph Alexander, F.
Coalter, Jno. L. Curry, and W. H. Flem-
ing.

Absent on account of illness: A. R.

pointed Member (Noll) was absent.

the last meeting the following communi-
cations have been received.

(1). Letter from Government dated
April 22, 1924, reading:

The Honorable,
The Chairman of the Colonial Council,
Municipality of St. Croix,
St. Croix, Virgin Islands.

Sir:-

I have the honor to quote herewith,
for your information and guidance, the
following letter received from His Ex-
cellency, the Governor of the Virgin Is-
lands.

"1. The Fort of Frederiksted is
hereby placed solely under the Juris-
diction of the Government of the Vir-
gin Islands and hereafter no part of it
will be considered Federal property.

"2. Notify all concerned of the fore-
going.

"PHILIP WILLIAMS."

The transfer of the property herein
referred to will become effective from this
date.

(2). Letter from Government dated
April 28, 1924, advising the Chairman of
the Colonial Council that the budget es-
timates for the fiscal year 1924-1925 has
been transmitted to the Chairman of the
Municipal Committee of St. Croix.

(3). Letter from Government dated
April 29, 1924, transmitting copy of a
resolution to provide for a means of
operating the well drilling equipment
for the drilling of public and private
well.

The Chairman read a letter from 8th
Elected Member for St. Thomas (Roths-
child Francis) in which the member re-
quest that his remark made in the Joint
Session of the Colonial Councils of St.
Thomas and St. John, and St. Croix on
April 4, 1924, viz: "I thought there were
sufficient members in these Councils that
love things American, that's why I
didn't bring it before the Councils." be
changed to read as follows: "I thought
there were "NOT" sufficient members
in these Councils that love things Ameri-
can, that's why I didn't bring it before
the Councils"

The (Acting Chairman) said the cor-
rection will be made accordingly.

The (Acting Chairman) read a letter of
resignation from the Honorable 2nd ap-
pointed Member (Noll) and said, -This
matters on the order of the day.

(4). Letter from Government dated
May 13, 1924, forwarding copy of a re-
port on the irrigation possibilities on the
island of St. Croix.

The report was laid on the table for
inspection.

(5). Letter from Government dated
May 24, 1924, reading:
