rates of the old Payne Aldrich tariff of 1920, according to members of the House Ways and Means Committee, they will be much higher than in the present Underwood tariff, in some special instances, the rates will even exceed those of the Payne Aldrich measures. The Bill will be introduced probably next Wednesday, and will be taken in the House for consideration after July 4th. A bitter fight is expected over it, especially in the Senate. The states valuation plan is included in the Bill. The lumber schedule is unsettled and probably will end in a controversy in the House itself. The agricultural rates are about on the level of the old Payne Aldrich rates.

Washington, June 25th.—Important developments in an effort to arouse the nation from the period of industrial depression, which it is experiencing may be expected as a result of the dinner given last night by President Harding to a group of bankers from the middle west. The dinner was followed by a discussion of domestic and international problems at the cabinet meeting yesterday, and by a conference on the railway situation attended by President Harding, Chairman Clark, of the interstate commerce commission Secretary Mellon and Director General of Railways Davis. The situation in which the railways of the nations find themselves, was accepted as the "emergency problem" which must be dealt with immediately. At all the sessions of the conference stress has been laid on the fact that if any of the railways of importance go into the hands of receivers, it would deal another blow at progress toward industrial rehabilitation.

Montreal, June 26th.—The members of the French Mission under Marshall Fayolle who arrived here on Saturday, were welcomed to Canada by the acting Prime Minister Mr. Doherty, whilst Senator Beaubien, presiding at the luncheon given them, welcomed them on behalf of French Canadians generally. Mr. Doherty spoke of his esteem, his admiration and profound affection for the guests and of his still more profound admiration and sincere love for the country which they represented. Senator Gaston Menier and the President of the Campagne Generale Transatlantique, performed the ceremony of inaugurating the exhibition train, and this took the form of a small model train. There will be 8 cars on the exhibition train and one of them showing the music, literature, education and theology of France, will be in charge of M. Poincare, ex-President of the French Republic. Others will be devoted to colonization, silk goods, eather work, chemistry, perfumes, scientific instruments, agricultural implements and Jewelry.
