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TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Cambridge, 14th.—Syracuse University La Crosse team defeated Cambridge University today 14 to 1. This is the United States teams 4th straight win.

New York, June 14th.—A steadier movement marked trading on the local raw sugar market early today. Prices were unchanged at 5 1/2 cents for Cuba's cost and freight, equal to 7.29 for centrifugal, with sales of 20,000 bags of Cubas. Renewed liquidation developed at the opening of the raw sugar futures market and first sales showed declines of 15 to 25 points. The selling seemed to come from Wall Street interests, attributed to Japanese traders, but offerings were well absorbed and after the early selling prices, rallied sharply on covering and commission house buying. The bulge lifted active positions three to six points above the previous closing. There were no further changes in refined sugar, with fine granulated listed at 9 15, but the demand was still light. Refined futures were nominal.

Brussels, June 14th.—The political crisis arising from the conflict in Parliament over the proposition to substitute the Flemish language for French in the university of Ghent, came to a climax this afternoon when, after the Senate had rejected a resolution introduced by Baron Charles De Broqueville for the use of the Flemish language alongside of French, the cabinet decided to resign. The King accepted the Cabinet's resignation. Not only was the Parliament split on the question, the Chamber approving the Flemish language and the Senate being opposed to it, but there

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was a division in the Cabinet itself, influential members, such as N. Van De Vyvere, favouring the preponderance of Flemish, although a majority of the cabinet members opposed it. In view of the impossibility of the cabinet reaching a unanimous conclusion as to its attitude on the subject, its resignation became inevitable.

Sofia, June 14th.—Ex-Premier Stambolisky was captured today at Molava village, near Slavotiza.

London, June 14th.—President Li Yuan-Hung of China, has resigned and turned over to his captors at Tientsin the Government seals which he took with him in his flight from Peking, says a despatch to the Evening Post from its Tientsin correspondent.

London, June 16th.—The touring West Indian cricket XI yesterday met the Northumberland XI at Newcastle. The West Indians went to bat first and scored 286: Scores were as follows—Fernandes 14, Challenor 105, Ince 43, Small 10, Hult 17, Nunes 5, Hunter (not out) 21, Constantine 21, Browne 18, Pascall 0, Francis 4, extras 28. Total 286. At the call of time Northumberland had scored twenty-four for the loss of two wicket. Scores were Strangerleathes 15, McKay 9, Bruce (not out) 0. Total 24. The match

will be concluded today, being only a two days game.
