

AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR A HEARSE AND DRIVER FOR CHRISTIANSTED AND FOR A HORSE, HEARSE AND DRIVER FOR FREDERIKSTED.

1. That a horse and hearse or carriage part and driver shall be provided to be used at the funerals of the poor and paupers and those who are unable to otherwise provide necessary conveyance in Christiansted and Frederiksted Towns and environments.

2. The care and control of the above shall be under the Prisor. Department who shall provide for and take care of the horses and conveyances and maintain the same in an orderly manner.

3. Applications for the use of the horses, hearses and drivers shall be made to the Chairman of the Poor Commission of Christiansted and Frederiksted who shall give the necessary instructions and see that the horses, hearses and drivers are provided.

Thus duly passed at the 4th Ordinary Meeting of the Colonial Council held Monday, December 15, 1919.

EDITORIALS.

We are informed that the Food Commission met yesterday and decided that the price of sugar should not be advanced for the present. It is also advised that the Commission will hold meetings, in Frederiksted tomorrow and in this town on Thursday at which the merchants will be heard as regards their stock of sugar and be required under oath to state the quantity they have on hand.

It is argued that the sugar factories hold considerable stocks of sugar and should be prepared to make some effort to relieve the present unusual condition of the market, and if necessary sustain some loss in doing so, they being in a more favorable position to sell sugar cheap than the few merchants who

have bought the sugar from the factories and at best made but small profit and hold no large supply. This contention may sound very well and perhaps it is not wholly unreasonable; but it must not be overlooked that the Factories have already sold to the local merchants considerably more sugar than has been consumed or, in fact, retailed since. This is an evidence that a surplus remains in the hands of those who ought to dispose of it at fair prices seeing that they cannot ship it and command the prices ruling in the States the lucrative market there being the excuse for wishing to put up prices here. Why should the sugar factories be required to surrender a part of their stock at this time when the very people to whom they sold it at the then low price still hold enough to meet the local demand for some time.

LOCAL.

It is learned that a merchant here has sold his stock of sugar for export to Porto Rico receiving 14 cents U. S. currency a pound.

The Lighthouse tender which arrived here on Saturday went to Frederiksted and left there yesterday taking Lieut. O'Hagan's family to Porto Rico where he is now stationed.

The New York quotation for sugar as published by the W. I. & P. Tel. Co., last night, is 15.30 cents; or 19.28 local currency. It is the highest price ever known quoted for sugar in all the annals of this island's history as sugar producing territory.
