PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

AT one o'clock p. m. Monday, February 14, 1921, the Colonial Council of St. Croix held its 5th Ordinary Meeting for the present elective period in the Colonial Council Hall at Christiansted.

His Excellency, Governor J. W. Oman, Lieutenant Commander John J. Gaffney and Government Secretary Timmons attended the meeting.

After prayers had been said the Chairman remarked: Honorable Members the minutes for the last meeting have been duly published in the "St. Croix Avis" as customary and if members have no objection I will declare same tacitly adopted.

There being no objections the Chairman declared the minutes as published tacitly adopted.

I have received words from 3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch) of his inability to attend the meeting today owing to illness.

The following communications received since the last meeting were then read:

1. Letter from Government of January 11 a. c., transmitting copy of an additional money bill with request that same be placed on the Order of the Day for the next meeting of the Council.

The Chairman remarked: This matter is before you as item 1 of the Order of the Day.

2. Letter from Government of January 20, a. c., transmitting statement of Municipal Treasury's Budget Revenues and Expenditures covering the period from 1, April, 1917 to June 30, 1920 with the request that same be laid be-

fore the Council as provided in Section 65 of the Colonial Law.

3. Letter from 1st Member for Christiansted Country District (Stakemann) under date of February 7, 1921, forwarding draft of an ordinance repealing an act to provide for the vesting of certain administrative and executive functions heretofore vested in certain Committee etc.

The Chairman remarked: This matter is before you today and will come up on 1st discussion.

Item 1.

Colonial Council Bill No. 53.

Introduction of and 1st Discussion on Colonial Council Bill No. 53, Additional Money Bill introduced by Government granting the Department of Education the sum of Fres. 23,812.00 for transfer of the Frederiksted High School and a further sum of Fres. 312.50 for the reimbursement of Theodore Roosevelt Grammar School for over payments of rent.

The Bill reads as follows:

Colonial Council Bill No. 53.

2nd Council, 2nd Session 1920-1921.

ADDITIONAL MONEY BILL
to the Budget for the Municipality of St. Croix, for the fiscal year ending 30th June 1921.

To the Department of Education (Maintenance) is hereby granted the sum of Fres. 23,812.00 for transfer to the Frederiksted High School Redemption Fund, and for further transfer to the Reserve Fund to cover the unpaid part of the loan of Francs 25,000.00 for the purchase of the Frederiksted High School building; and a further sum of Fres. 312.50 for the reimbursement of Theodore Roosevelt Grammar School for overpayments of rent; provided that in future the Government may rent to private parties such part of the Frederiksted High School building as may not be needed by the Department of Education,—the money so received to be deposited in the treasury of the Municipality of St. Croix.

Proposed by Government.

Government Secretary (Timmons) remarked: Mr. Chairman As this Money Bill has been recommended by the Municipal Committee the Government will appreciate remarks by the Chairman of the Committee.

4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) remarked: Mr. Chairman. The amount called for in this money bill is to close off the debt of the Frederiksted High School to the Reserve Fund, also of the
