TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Oppeln, Upper Silesia, May 9th.—French soldiers today shot into a crowd of Germans, who were threatening a Polish prisoner, killing two and wounding several others. The burgomaster issued a proclamation, urging the population to maintain peace and have confidence in the allied commission.

London, May 9th.—Mr. Lloyd George in responding in the House of Commons today to questions regarding the upper Silesia situation and its possible effect on the German answer to the Allied demands, said that he might not be prepared to agree with the contention that Germany's answer would necessarily be influenced by Silesian trouble, yet it was very unfortunate that this incident should have arisen at the moment when Germany was deciding as to the disarmament demands. Asked if Great Britain could not do more towards settling the trouble by influencing the Polish Govt. the Prime Minister said, "We are doing everything in our power to bring such pressure as we can on the Polish Govt."

London, May 9th.—The King has appointed Crown Prince Hirohito of Japan a Knight Grand Cross of the Order of the Bath.

Berlin, May 9th.—The majority socialists and clericals in party conferences today voted in favour of accepting the ultimatum of the Allies. The German peoples party, by a vote of 59 to 5, rejected the proposal. The Democrats were in session at midnight. As the Independent socialists have already proposed yielding to the Allies, it is believed there

will be a sufficient majority in the Reichstag for acceptance of the ultimatum Paul Loebe, of the Majority Socialists and President of the Reichstag, will be commissioned by President Ebert with the task of forming a new Cabinet. Late tonight the party of leaders admitted that there would be available on Tuesday in the Reichstag a safe majority in favour of accepting the Allied ultimatum with regard to reparations.

London, May 9th.—The lockout of the sea-going stewards and cooks, which began on May 6th by the shipping com-

panies, because of the men's refusal to accept a wage-cut of about 17%, took a serious turn today, when a manifesto was issued by the National Union of Ship Stewards and Cooks, declaring the offers of the owners of the old rate of pay, in order to get a ship away must not be accepted.
