(Convened by request of Government.)

1. Colonial Council Bill No. 1.
Introduction of and 1st Discussion on Colonial Council Bill No. 1, draft of Budget for the Municipality of St. Croix for the fiscal year from July 1, 1921 to June 30, 1922. Introduced by Government.
