

AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR A HEARSE AND DRIVER FOR CHRISTIANSTED AND FOR A HORSE, HEARSE AND DRIVER FOR FREDERIKSTED.

1. That a horse and hearse or carriage part and driver shall be provided to be used at the funerals of the poor and paupers and those who are unable to otherwise provide necessary conveyance in Christiansted and Frederiksted Towns and environments.

2. The care and control of the above shall be under the Prison Department who shall provide for and take care of the horses and conveyances and maintain the same in an orderly manner.

3. Applications for the use of the horses, hearses and drivers shall be made to the Chairman of the Poor Commission of Christiansted and Frederiksted who shall give the necessary instructions and see that the horses, hearses and drivers are provided.
