should eventually occur within his own party. Under the present parliamentary regime, the Premier of Italy cannot be overthrown by minority opposition parties, but only by his own party. Mussolini arranged this before the election.

Prince Rupert, B. C. April 7th—Additional delay in the American round-the-world air flight was declared necessary today, as the result of damage to Major F. L. Martin's plane which broke two struts in landing here late on Saturday and the flight cannot be resumed until the damage is repaired. It probably will be necessary to ship the spare parts here.

New York, April 7th.—Frank Marshall of New York, chess champion of the United States, upset calculations in the 15th round of the international tournament yesterday by defeating Richard Beti of Czecho-Slovakia in three moves. Alexander Alekhine of Russia won from F. Yates of England after thirty two moves.

Capetown, April 7th.—It was officially announced today that the Government of the Union of South Africa, has requested the Prince of Wales to defer his anticipated visit. As the elections are fixed for June, the projected visit of the Prince would be interfered with.

London, April 7th.—The announcement of the postponement of the Prince of Wales visit to South Africa, which created a sensation in London, is explained by Government officials on the ground that if His Royal Highness were in South Africa while the general election is proceeding, there might be danger of some procession, or other function arranged in his honour, being turned to political account by one or other of the parties in South Africa.
