

be secured within any of the cities supplied with electric lights. It is gradually beginning to dawn upon all the people that there has got to be a way out of this trouble, while we can get all the silks and satins and pianos that we want we simply can't get the sugar. Within the last two weeks, in the property under our own control, the storekeeper asserted that the city merchant could not supply the sugar desired and that the store was out of sugar.

The Cuban sugar planters are endeavoring to increase their production of white sugars so as to be warranted in making them perhaps exclusively. In the old days of Spanish rule or misrule, a large percentage of white sugar was made in Cuba and exported to Spain. Cuba can just as well export white sugars to all the world and that is now being done in Java and in Mauritius, and yet we here, in Cuba and in Louisiana, among the most enterprising sugar planters in the world, are allowing these great monopolies to buy the sugar in Cuba, carry it to their refineries and to melt it up and then re-manufacture it again into sugar crystals, all of which can be avoided by adopting the very readily obtainable modern methods. What shall we do about it?—*Louisiana Planter.*

FROM THE POLICE.

THE attention of all owners and drivers of low carts, porters, and cartmen in the Island of St. Croix is hereby called to the following paragraphs of the Ordinance of 15th May 1875 concerning Porters and Cartmen.

Paragraph 17th.

"Carts must always be loaded in a proper manner, so that there be no danger of their being upset, or of their dropping the load, or of their breaking down on the way, of their causing damage or inconvenience to the traffic, or to passers by. No cart-load with one horse, must, *without special permission*, be of a greater weight than 800 lbs. on level ground, and half of that weight up-hill.

Paragraph 18.

"The Police may cause vehicles (carts, horses, and harness) to be examined at any time, in order to ascertain whether they are in a state suited to the requirements and safety of the public, and adapted to the other considerations that must be observed. If any portion of the vehicle be found incomplete, or out of order, the Police will give the necessary injunction, which must always be obeyed without delay; the Police may also, if considered necessary, prohibit further use for a time, or permanently, of the vehicle, either the whole or any part thereof, and the parties are furthermore liable to other responsibility according to law, *especially the enactments concerning punishment for ill-treatment of animals*, and to the forfeiture of their 'sense'."
