

Observers say that the enemy has not yet in position, guns heavy enough to reach this city with their fire. On the north eastern front, along the Bialystok road, the Russians are 21 miles from Warsaw. The Russians attacking Warsaw have worked well towards the rear of the city's defences and are taking Plock within a dozen miles of the Vistula, northwest of the Polish capital, according to Friday night's official Polish communication.

Antwerp, Aug. 14th.—France won the 170 kilometres road race, the Olympic bicycle class here on Thursday, Sweden was second, Belgium third and Denmark fourth.

Paris, Aug. 15th.—Warsaw was still holding out as far as is known, but the battle raging under the walls of the city is increasing in violence. From the vague and scanty news reaching Paris, the Poles are making a good fight, but seemingly all they can hope for is to delay the fatal hour of the city's fall. The Reds are continuing to advance, and have reached a point less than ten miles from the capital.

London, Aug. 15th.—The sensational reports emanating from Dublin last night to the effect that Mr. Bonar Law would make a statement in the House of Commons on Monday relative to the granting to Ireland of more generous forms of self-Government in the nature of Dominion Home Rule, were received with scepticism here today. There is no official confirmation of the story, and indeed, the Irish Office declares it knows nothing about such a move. Dublin still insists that Mr. Wylie, a legal adviser to Viscount French, decided to resign, but delayed action on the understanding that Mr. Bonar Law would make the statement referred to in the reports.

Paris, Aug. 15th. Renewed American intervention in Europe appears imminent from statements made today in authoritative French quarters where it is affirmed America, France and Great Britain are conferring with the object of reaching an agreement for joint action in Poland.

Cork, Aug. 15th.—Mr. Mac Sweeney, the Lord Mayor, of this city and ten men who were arrested on Thursday night have refused food since they were placed in a military barracks and have been joined in their hunger strike by other prisoners.

Kolno, Poland, (By Courier to Blotowen, East Prussia,) Aug. 15th.—Soviet Russia intends to seek an alliance with Germany to make war on France and if this is successful, to undertake a conquest of England and eventually the United States, officials of the Bolshevik regime told the associated press here yesterday. As soon as the Polish war, which is considered a purely Russian business, has been finished, a note will be sent to Berlin, they declared, demanding permission to transport troops across Germany for the French campaign. which is taken for granted, a revolution will be instituted in Germany, the success of which the Bolshevik asserted, they were prepared to assure by force of arms. The Bolshevik leaders declare that within three weeks, they will be in complete command of Poland, including the Polish corridor which they intend to occupy, leaving a ten kilometre neutral zone above Danzig.

London, Aug. 16th.—The Russians are pressing their fight for Warsaw within a dozen miles of the capital on the north-east, it is indicated from Sunday's official statement from Moscow received today. They report the capture of Radzymin in this sector and the continuation of the battle along this front and also near Novogeorgievsk to the northwest of Warsaw.

London, August 15th.—No news has yet reached London of the peace meeting between the Polish and Soviet representatives at Minsk. The central news learns that a number of the journalists accompanying the Polish delegates have not been allowed to cross the Russian lines.
