## PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

ON Saturday, August 6, 1921, at two o'clock p. m., the Colonial Council for St. Croix held an extraordinary meeting in the Colonial Council Hall in Christiansted, convened by request of Government.

The members present were: The Vice-Chairman (Coulter), K. Henderson, Thos. Ramsay, Robt. W. Skeoch, M. M. Skeoch, J. Alexander, W. S. Abramson, D. Noll, A. V. Nelthropp, D. S. Armstrong, A. J. Blackwood, F. Andersen and G. B. Fleming.

Absent were: The Chairman (Merwin), F. Lunney, A. E. Stakemann and G. Nordby.

Government Secretary (Timmons) attended the meeting.

After prayers had been said the Chairman (Coulter) asked the Assistant Secretary to act as Secretary as the Secretary to the Council was absent.

Accordingly the Assistant Secretary took the chair.

The Chairman then read the following communications to the Council received since the last meeting.

1. Letter from Government of July 15, a. c., reading:

GOVERNMENT OF THE VIRGIN ISLANDS  
OF THE UNITED STATES, ST. THOMAS.

15 July. 1921.

Sir.---

The Colonial Council for the Municipality of St. Croix is hereby informed that the Governor of the Virgin Islands of the United States was today officially advised by radio that an Act of Congress signed by the President, 12 July, 1921, and effective 1 July, 1921, contained the two following provisos:

"Provided that no person owing allegiance to any country other than the United States of America shall be eligible to hold office as a member of the Colonial Council of the Virgin Islands of the United States nor to hold any public office under the Government of said islands:

Provided further that the income tax laws now in force in the United States of America and those which may hereafter be enacted shall be likewise in force in the Virgin Islands of the United States except that the proceeds of such taxes shall be paid into the treasuries of said islands."

The Governor requests to be advised by the Council as to the names of the members of the Council affected by this legislation and the seats which thereby automatically become vacant.
