LOCAL.

Words are weak to express the praise, admiration and appreciation felt and evinced for the performance staged by the Christiansted Junior High School at the theatre on Wednesday evening, and it is very gratifying to be able to announce that it was a perfect success, to which all those interested contributed and of which they may justly be proud. It would be impracticable to enumerate the various features of the programme

which was well carried out on the whole, but it would be an unjust omission if special comment be not made on the excellence of the stage settings which were so true to life and so befitting to each change of scene as to be truly marvellous. This work is to the credit of the principal, Mr. Juan Rivera who is an artist of great skill. The portrait of President Harding was an excellent hand production of Master Melville Stevens and deserves great commendation. The likeness was perfectly portrayed, and the neatness of the work very striking at the closest observation. This portrait was presented to His Excellency the Governor who in accepting, left his seat and from the platform delivered an appropriate address of encouragement, and appreciation individually to young Stevens, and in general. It is learnt that the frame in which the portrait was presented was also made by Stevens. The theatre was crowded scarcely standing room being available, and the entertainment lasted until a late hour, everybody going home well satisfied.

A football match played on the Parade Ground yesterday afternoon between the Merry Jurvenile (formerly the Fearless) and Excelsior Clubs resulted in a victory for the former by 2 goals to none.

The Vixen with His Excellency the Governor and the Government Secretary sailed for St. Thomas at 5 p. m. yesterday, also carrying mail for St. Thomas.

The Colonial Council convened yesterday in fourth ordinary meeting. The Government Secretary and the Despatching Secretary were present, as also all members with four exceptions.

The Order of the Day was disposed of as follows: Item No. 1, Bill No. 12 providing for assessment, levy and collection of taxes on real and personal pro-

perty, referred to a committee of the whole house. Item No. 2: passed that printed copies of the minutes of the Municipal Committee be printed in pamphlet form and circulated among members. Item No 3: Elected as members of the Road Commission, Messrs. G. B. Fleming, F. Andersen. A. J. Blackwood, M. M. Skoech Item No. 4, Bill No. 13 providing free pilotage at Christiansted for vessels engaged in carrying mail between Porto Rico and St. Croix, passed three discussions.

The Murder Case.

Preliminary Hearing of People vs.
George Jemmott.

(Continued from yesterday's Avis.)

On resumption of the investigation at 2 p. m. the defence called as a witness Dr. Dukeshire of the Frederiksted Municipal Hospital, who on being sworn, testified that he had performed the autopsy on the body of the deceased Caroline Jarvis.

He had found a gunshot wound on the side of the neck, entering in at the angle of the Jaw, penetrating the neck. No wound of exit was found.

The hole of the wound was approximately half inch across. It was a circular hole not jagged.

The surrounding tissues showed no wide spread laceration or damage other than that of a rather blackened area of
