PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

ON Monday, June 4, 1923, at 8 o'clock p.m. the Colonial Council of St. Croix, at the request of Government, convened in extraordinary session.

The members present were: The Acting Chairman (Merwin), W. S. Abramson, D. S. Armstrong, Halvor Berg, D. Hamilton Jackson, Robt. W. Skeoch, M. M. Skeoch, Jos. Alexander, F. Coulter, Jno. L. Curry, D. C. Canegata, F. A. dersen, Holger Jessen, A. R. McIntosh, Thos. Ramsay and A. J. Blackwood.

Despatching Secretary (Rappolee) and Lieutenant Roy E. Barrett were present at the meeting.

The Acting Chairman asked 3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch) to act as Secretary of the Council until the officials of the Council were appointed.

Accordingly the member took the seat. The following prayers were offered by the Chaplain, Rev. W. Allen:

Almighty God, Thou who dost guide the affairs of men, and from whom cometh all wisdom, guide and direct we pray Thee this Council and give to its members the needed wisdom that in all their deliberations they may seek the welfare of this people and thy glory. We ask for Jesus' sake.

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven, give us this day our daily

bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil, for thine is the kingdom, and the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

OFFICIAL NOTES.

Captain Arthur E. Lindborg, who has been serving as senior Assistant Director of Education in Saint Croix, has been appointed Director of Education for the Virgin Islands vice Daniel R. Nase, who has resigned effective 30 June 1923.

Mr. Nase has been Director of Education for over three years, and has done the bulk of the pioneer work in organizing the school system since the islands have been under the United States flag. It is Mr. Nase's intention to continue his studies in the University of Chicago.

The resignation of Mr. H. R. Hilsabeck as Assistant Director of Education for Saint Thomas has been accepted with regret by the Governor.
