TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London, Dec. 6th.—A definite promise of allegiance to the Empire by the Sinn Fein is provided for in the Irish peace terms the Central News states. The agreement, it says, is satisfactory to the King, in that it involves Ireland's association with the Empire.

London, December 6th.—The Evening Standard says that the Govt's proposals for an Irish settlement, upon which agreement was reached this morning, provide for an Irish free state, withdrawal of all military forces from Ireland and safeguards which will insure peaceful conditions.

Birmingham, Dec. 6th.—Ireland hereafter will be known officially as "the Irish free state", under the agreement reached at last night's London Conference, it was announced by Lord Birkenhead in an address here today.

London, Dec 6th. Denial was given today at the home of Ex-Emperor William at Doorn, Holland, of the report of his betrothal, says a despatch to the Daily Mail from Doorn.

London, Dec. 6th.—Reuters Melbourne correspondent cables that there are reiterated demands upon the federal Government of Australia for the resumption of trade with Germany. Imports from Germany are supposed to be absolutely barred, but it is apparent that indirect operations in this line are proceeding to a considerable extent and are nullifying the effects of the prohibition. The Australian steel works threaten to close down owing to alleged heavy importations through intermediate countries and now demand higher duties, combined with anti dumping legislation. The Government proposed to revoke the prohibitory proclamation, but will suspend the operation of the revocation until the anti-dumping bill can be considered in Parliament.

New York, Dec. 6th.—The early raw sugar market was quiet and unchanged new crop Cuba's were offered as low as 3.66 for centrifugal, the lowest in several years, while the committee's price for the old crop is 4.11.

Berlin, Dec. 6th.—It is reported that 100 persons lost their lives today as the result of the explosion of an oil tank in the Noben dynamite works at Vaarlouis, Rhenish Prussia. The works are burning.

Washington, Dec. 6th.—The President informed Congress today, in his first annual message, that a "most gratifying world accomplishment" by the armament conference "is not improbable." The message was delivered
