TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London, Sept. 19th.—The labour ministry states that sixteen tables of statistics show a decrease of two per cent in the cost of living at September first, as compared with August first, and that the cost of living is now one hundred and twenty per cent above pre-war figures.

Dublin, Sept. 19th.—Mr. De Valera may call the Dail Eireann into session to deliberate on the situation brought about by the latest note sent to Dublin by Mr. Lloyd George.

Calicut, British, India, Sept. 19th.—Reports from the town of Nilambur, about twenty-five miles east of this city, state that chief Kunhammad has proclaimed the districts of Urund and Malluvanad as an independent moslem kingdom, and he is said to threaten a massacre of Europeans there.

London, Sept. 19th.—The "Yorkshire Post", the chief organ of the Government in the north of England, utters a warning against the scheme of Mr. Winston Churchill for grouping the crown colonies and the crown states for administrative purposes under a high commissioner for each group. The "Post" says it by no means follows that the scheme will meet with the approval of the colonies concerned, each of which has a very distinct character and that there is indeed danger in the effort, now evident in more than one field of imperial administration, to create a sealed pattern of organization on one universal model.

London, Sept. 19th.—The first of the

balloons to get away in the James Gordon Bennett international race, which started yesterday, was heard from this morning. This was the "Banshee", an English entry, piloted by Baldwin. The message said the "Banshee" had landed at Sarnau, near Carnarthena, Wales."

Philadelphia, Sept. 19th.—William Tilden of this city is again the national champion. He won the 1921 title by defeating Wallace Johnson, also of this city, by 6-1, 6-3, 6-1, in the final round of the twentieth annual championship singles tournament of the United States tennis association, in what is said to be the record time of forty-three minutes. He rose to super heights in his play this afternoon and the speed and accuracy of both his service and return strokes so dazzled and smothered Johnson, that the latter was placed in such a position that he never for a moment appeared to have even a fighting chance.
