Mr Ashley Totten and Miss Elizabeth Hendrickson, delegates of the Virgin Islands Protective League of New York addressed a gathering in the Sunday Market last night, introducing the organization, and exhorting the people to choose proper leaders and be advised as to certain ways and means of dealing with the American people to achieve the best results.

The speakers delivered themselves well and said many things that can be endorsed, but a statement of Miss Hendrickson that the negro race is the same place to-day as it was a hundred years ago because of lack of unity, is so glaringly erroneous that it cannot be explained. It is a well known fact that the negro race has made more progress and advanced more during the last 100 years than ever before.

Another remark of this lady that all who have a drop of "colored blood", are black, is logically incorrect. The people of mixed blood are neither black nor can they be called negroes in a correct sense of the term, even though this may be the custom in America. We have the highest regard for the colored races and think such remarks, unconsciously made perhaps, tend to represent such races in a derogatory light.
