

ORDINANCE

roviding a Schedule of Fees
or use of Slaughter Houses in
St. Croix.

Be it enacted by the Colonial
Council in session assembled: That

1. From and after July 1st, 1924, the
fees charged for use of slaughter houses
shall be such as are herein provided and
payable in advance before the time of
inspection of the animal:

For slaughtering of cattle.....	Frs. 1.25 per head.
For slaughtering of sheep and goats ..	0.50 ..
For slaughtering of hogs.....	0.50 ..

2. All fees accruing hereunder shall be
payable at the Sanitation Office and be
by them paid into the Colonial Treasury
each month.

Thus duly passed at the last ordinary
meeting of the Colonial Council held Mon-
day, June 23 1924.

Hurricane Signals.

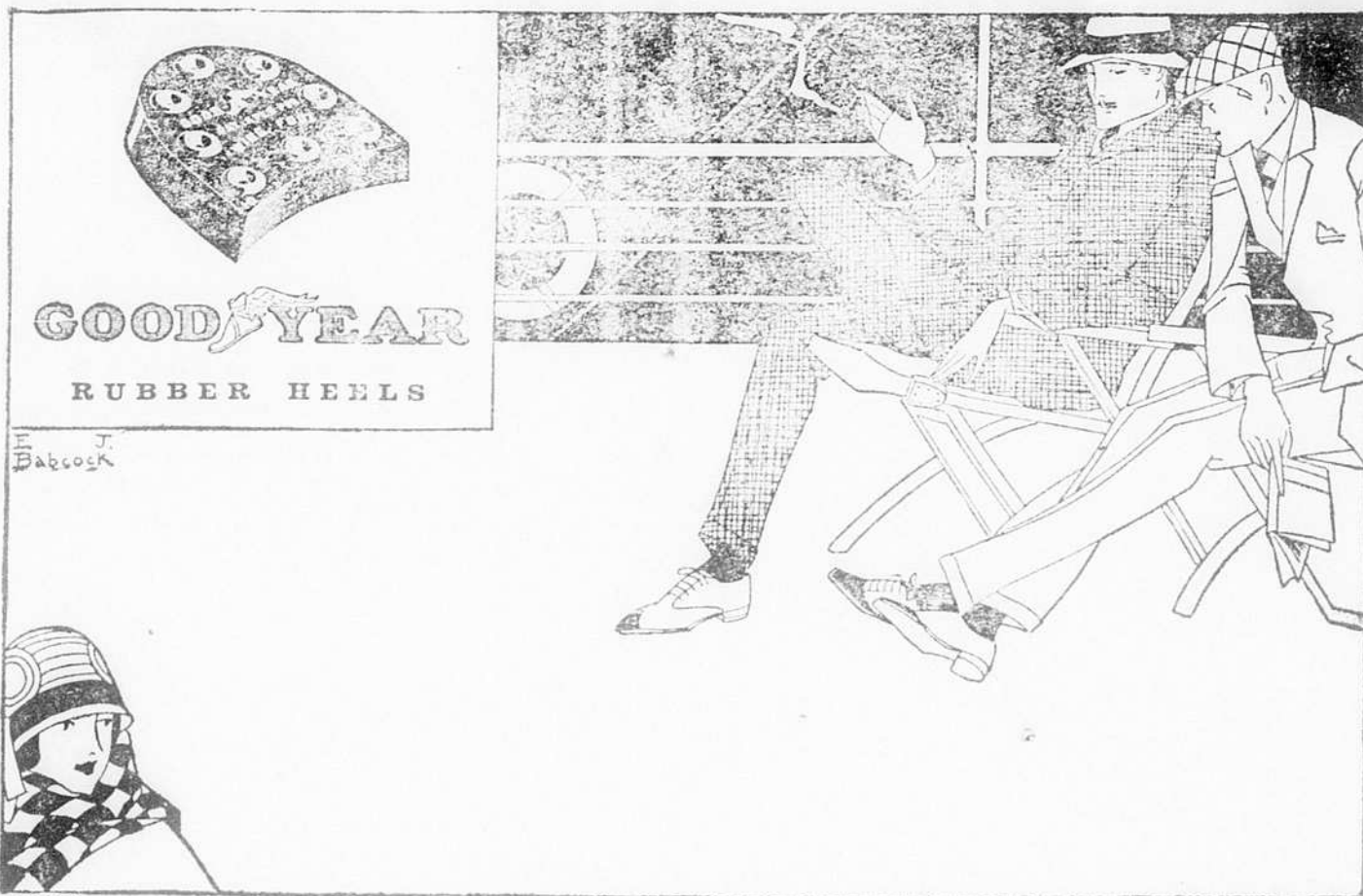
IN the event of an impending hurri-
cane, the following signals will be
given from the Forts at Christiansted,
Frederiksted, and King's Hill;—and the
telephone centrals will also inform all
subscribers—(country ones first.)

During the day:—One hurricane flag—
(a red flag with a
black square in the
centre) will be flown.
If this island is in the
path of the hurricane,
TWO HURRICANE
FLAGS (one above the
other) will be flown.

During the night:—Two rockets will be
fired at an interval of
five minutes.

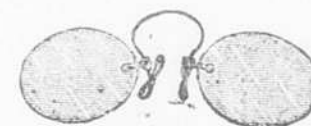
