THE Inspection of the general annual repairs of the Public roads, with Bridges, Culverts, water courses, side walls, hand rails, etc. etc. shall commence after the 15th February.

As it has been found during the Inspection last year that the trees and bushes along the roadsides were not trimmed, and therefore are an inconvenience to the Public traffic.

It is the Owner of the land, who is responsible for keeping them, from inconveniencing the Public, or damaging vehicles on the roadway and will be held for damage.

Boundary posts must be plainly marked, on each allotment and planted firmly in the ground.

• When the Inspection is completed, and the roads found in order, the Roads will be Reallotted, for the next term.

## Executive Order No. 9.

THE following additional Regulations governing the sale of bay rum promulgated in pursuance of law, will be effective within the Virgin Islands of the United States on and after February 1, 1920:

Bay Rum shall be sold only on delivery of a permit issued by the Police Department.

Applicants for permit must satisfy the Police Department that the applicant will not use the bay rum for beverage purposes.

Section 4 of Executive Order No. 2, dated July 7th, 1919, wherein such sales were authorized upon the buyer's prior delivery to the seller of an application to purchase, is hereby amended accordingly.

## Publication.

It is hereby brought to public notice that Income Tax returns may be obtained at the office of the Despatching Secretary. Special attention is invited to the following requirements concerning Income Tax.

A return is required of each and every person (including corporations) having a total (gross) income of Francs 4500.00 or over.

For a failure to make return on or about March 31, any person (including corporations) required to do so by the terms of the Ordinance shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Francs 100.00 nor more than Francs 5,000.00
