ERRATUM.

Paragraph 13, Bulletin 24th, read: Admiral Sir David Beatty instead of Vice-Admiral.

Berne, Sept. 24th.—The Polish Press Bureau here announces that the army of General Danekine, opperating in South Russia, has formed a junction with Polish forces near Kerostene. If the above report should be true it would mean that the Polish forces under General Denekine will be able to coordinate their efforts in fighting the Bolshevik in south Russia.

Washington, Sept. 24th.—Under a resolution introduced today by Representative Husted, Republican for New York, the House would go on record as opposing any interference by American forces in the situation at Fiume. Mr. Husted will appear before the Foreign Affairs Committee tomorrow and urge immediate action on his resolution.

Grenada, Sept. 26th.—H. E. the Governor Sir George Basil Haddon-Smith, K. C. M. G., left for St. Vincent by S. S. Caraque this morning. During his absence the Honourable E. D. Laborde, I. S. O., Acting Colonial Secretary, will assume administration of the local Government.

St. Vincent, Sept. 25th Slight earth tremor here 12.18 p. m.

Antigua, Sept. 25th.—Sharp shock earthquake 12.32 p. m.

Washington, Sept. 24th Official advices received by the State Department today from Omsk under yesterday's indicated that Admiral Kolchak has not resigned and that he did not contemplate such action. The advance against the Bolsheviki is progressing favourably to the Kolchak whose armies are in a stronger position than they have been for some time.

Paris, Sept. 24th—The Supreme Council of the peace conference at this morning's session approved the report of the Commission on Spitzbergen granting to Norway political suzerainty over the Spitzbergen Archipelago. The Council also decided that the Congu territory in Northern Mozambique, detached from the German colonial possessions, should be given to Portugal.

New York, Sept. 25th—Twelve American owned steamships aggregating 70,000 dead weight tons and valued at more than ten million dollars, the property of a German subsidiary of the Standard Oil Co., of New Jersey, have been ordered from German ports to the Firth of Forth for allocation among the Allied and Associated Nations recently at war against Germany. This information has been received by officials of the Standard Oil Co. here from its representative abroad. The action has been protested by the Company through both the State Department and Shipping Board.

New York, Sept. 25th.—Plans have been formulated for an aerial Derby around the world for which the prize may total 1,000,000 pounds, it was announced today by the Aero Club of America. A special commission has been appointed and will start next month on a tour of the world to arrange routes and landing places, to obtain referees and to organize committees in every country throughout which the race will pass.

London, Sept. 25th. The Parliamentary Committee of the Trades Union Congress drafted a demand today for presentation to the Government, dealing with the nationalization of the mine, in pursuance of the resolution in the recent Glasgow Congress. It is understood it is not an ultimatum but it is couched in strong terms.

Denver, Sept. 25th.—Declaring the issue in the peace treaty discussion at last had been "clearly drawn", President Wilson said in an address here today that the question squarely facing the nation was whether the United States would keep its pledges to help guarantee the peace of the world.
