TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London, Nov. 12th.—As the result of the voting today for the bye-election in Harnsey, made vacant by the death of Mr. Kennedy Jones, the Conservatives were successful in electing their candidate Viscount Ednam. Over sixty per cent of the elections polled their votes, the result being Viscount Ednam, Conservative, 15,959, Mr. Leslie Burgin, Independent Liberal, 13,943.

London, Nov. 12th.—The secretary of the "Save the Children" fund for the benefit of the Russian famine districts emphasizes the generous subscriptions from the Dominions. Subscriptions so far reported total, New Zealand £59,000, Canada £9,000, South Africa £45,000. A single Australian town sent £9,000. The fund now totals over a million pounds, but more is urgently needed.

London, Nov. 13th.—With Collins scoring a double century and his colleague Gregory hitting up 119, the Australian batsmen completely collared the South African bowling in the initial day's play of the second test match according to a Reuter despatch from Johannesburg.
