is all confusion and the failure to ratify the Peace Treaty and the delay in regard to reconstructive measures will prevent early activity in the selection of candidates, speaking of the exchange situation, he characterized it as a dreadful situation, and said that one reason why he was anxious to see the peace treaty ratified was that exchange throughout the world might become more established. One reason for the situation was lack of equality.

Washington, March 1st.—An early and favourable vote on the ratification of the Peace Treaty was forecasted in the Senate today when the Republican leaders reaffirmed their decision not to accept any change in the substance of the language in the Republican reservation to Article Ten.

Washington, March 2nd.—The representatives of the Railway unions are understood to have voted today to give the New Railway Law a trial in the bringing about a settlement of their wage demands.

Paris, March 1st.—An Exchange of views in the financial and Economic section of the Supreme Council, according to "Pertinax" of the Echo de Paris, writing at London, indicates that, "That section, so disunited since the armistice on a common line of conduct. This, he adds, is to be taken in connection with the League of Nations international credit Conference. The political section of the Council on Saturday discussed the alleged Armenian massacres, continues the writer, and Mr. Lloyd George insisted that Great Britain, France and Italy act accordingly to convince the Sultan that he ought to stop these horrors.

Washington, March 2nd.—The adoption unchanged of the Republican Peace Treaty Reservation regarding domestic questions was forecasted in the Senate when a substitute offered by Senator Hitchcock of Nebraska, the Administration Leader, was rejected by a vote of 36 to 44.
