PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Concluded from Saturday's Avis.)

3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch) would like to draw attention to the fact that the hurricane season is approaching and if this matter is delayed for any length of time it might place the community in a precarious position.

4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) then read a letter from Henry Head & Co. Ltd., Brokers for the Insurance Company.

Government Secretary (Gaffney) would like to know the date the letter was written.

The Chairman replied: 29th March.

Government Secretary (Gaffney) said:-- The first time this Bill was brought to my attention was the 24th of April, and Government ask that 1st Discussion be not closed today.

It was put to the vote and unanimously carried that the Bill be furthered.

The Chairman remarked: At the request of Government 1st Discussion on the Bill remains open until next meeting.

The Chairman further remarked: Before giving a recess I wish to draw attention that each year the Council elects four Members to serve on the Electoral Board. As the election is for one year only, I wish to bring the matter up to-

day so that the Council may elect the members.

For last year the following were elected:

For Christiansted Town: D. C. Canegata.

For Christiansted Country District: Robt. W. Skeoch.

For Frederiksted Town: Robt. L. Merwin.

For Frederiksted Country District: G. B. Fleming.

The Chairman then gave a recess of 10 minutes.

After recess the Council reconvened and the Chairman asked Members to prepare their voting tickets for a committee of 5 members to receive and report on Colonial Council Bill No. 18.

11 voting tickets were handed in.

Elected were: 2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) and 1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) with 11 votes respectively, 1st Member for Frederiksted Town (Coulter) with 9 votes, 3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander) with 8 votes and 5th Appointed Member (McIntosh) with 7 votes.

3rd Member for Christiansted Country District (Robt. W. Skeoch) received 5 votes 2nd Member for Frederiksted Town (Merwin) 2 votes and 1st Appointed Member (Hendersen) and 1st Member for Christiansted Town (Abramson) received one vote respectively.

The Chairman asked the Committee to meet after the Council Meeting to elect its Chairman.

The Chairman then asked Members to prepare their voting tickets for Election

of men to the various Electoral Boards as customary.

Accordingly 12 voting tickets were handed in for the election of four men to serve on the Electoral Board.

Elected were:

For Christiansted Town: D. C. Canegata.

For Christiansted Country District: Robt. W. Skeoch.

For Frederiksted Town: Robt. L. Merwin.

For Frederiksted Country District: G. B. Fleming.

Outside of the Order of the Day the Chairman remarked: A suggestion has been made that Members meet after the Council meeting today to hold a Committee Meeting of the whole House upon the Tax Ordinance instead of this evening.

After some discussion it was put to the vote and carried that the meeting take place immediately after the Council Meeting.

There being no further business before the House the Chairman declared the meeting closed at 5 p. m.

Some days ago my attention was called to the fact that an association against the prohibition amendment which has a following of over five hundred thousand persons in New York City, and whose activities are assuming very large proportions throughout the entire United States of America, were holding meetings at Carnegie Hall.

It came to my mind, that it would be a fine thing to lay the cause of prohibition and its effects on the Virgin Islands, and thus give the commissioners who are coming to this country a fair opportunity of reaching the American nation.

I immediately communicated with the Managing Vice President Capt W. H. Stayton U. S. N. (retired) asking that the commission be given an opportunity to speak at one or two of their meetings, with knowledge of the fact that their words would arouse the sympathy of America, as the result.
