S. S. 'FORT VICTORIA'

200 PASSENGERS ABOARD DELIGHTED WITH ISLAND'S SCENERY.

The S/S "Fort Victoria" entered our port early this morning.

This ship is 14,000 tons registered, has a speed of 16 knots and carries a crew of one hundred and seventy. She is an oilburner.

She is the picture of grandeur and surpasses anything seen in this port before.

Wandering down the corridors one's eyes are presented with 150 comfortable and well furnished cabins. There are also fifteen Cabins de Luxe, & 20 baths.

There is a spacious and exquisitely furnished Music room, a Library, Lounge, Palm Court, Smoking room, a Barber Saloon and a small printing Press, for menu and card printing.

The dining room is a spacious hall covering the whole of the 3rd deck, and is so clean, and attractive looking, there seem to be nothing to prevent the jolly company enjoying the tasty dishes.

Music is pretty well supplied: there is a Victrola, piano, and a small Orchestra.

A very courteous staff of officers crowd this ship. Those of note are: Capt Mc Kenzie a noble looking personage, and evidently very pleasant; Chief officer Mr. Francis, Chief Engineer Mr. Wapsett, Purser Mr. Cooper, Chief Steward Mr. Campbell, 2nd. Steward Mr. Brennan.
