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TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Dublin, April 27th.—The Roman Catholic bishops at a meeting at Maynooth yesterday issued the following statement. "Nothing but the good sense and solid virtue of the body of the people has saved us so far from anarchy and civil war, unfortunately the general public can up to now only look on with helpless anguish while everything dear to them, social order, life, property and national dignity is being hacked to pieces by senseless military contentions operations. Like the great bulk of the nations, we think the best and wisest course for Ireland is to accept the treaty and make the most of the freedom, undoubtedly freedom for the first time in seven hundred years". The bishops repudiate the idea that Catholics and Sinn Feiners are the instigators of the trouble in the North.

London, April 27th.—Acting Commander Michael O'Neill, of the third Cork brigade of the Irish Republican army, was shot and killed near Bandon, County Cork, yesterday. He was accompanying other officers and officials on duty to a farmhouse some distance from the town and was fired at point blank, without warning. A member of the farmers family was arrested.

Dublin, April 27th. The Irish irregular troops at Mullingar, at eight o'clock this evening vacated the public buildings they had been holding and left Mullingar. This movement was in answer to an ultimatum issued by General Makeown, of the regular Irish forces who gave the irregulars five hours notice to leave the town, or surrender.

New York, April 27th—Mr. Charles W Morse, the New York financier, his

three sons and seventeen other defendants were today indicted by a Federal Grand Jury on a charge of using the mails to defraud in respect of the sale of stock in various steamship companies.

Fort Worth, Texas April 27th—It is estimated that property damage amounting probably to two million dollars will be found to have been caused, when the flood sites have been investigated.

Natchez Mississippi, April 27th.—The break in the banks of the Mississippi river is widening and the floods have inundated Ferriday, in Louisiana, situated four miles from the break. Vidalia and five other towns, with a population of two thousand, are in the immediate track of the floods, but ample warning has been given the inhabitants to enable them to escape.

Moscow, April 27th.—M Tchitcherin, head of the Soviet delegation, at Genoa has been informed by his Govt that the policy of the delegation is approved but that in granting any concessions to the Allies care is to be taken that the rights and political freedom of the Soviet work-

ers are not interfered with.

Rio De Janeiro, April 27th.—Congressmen confirm the reports published by the newspapers that a sanguinary revolt, participated in by the people and the police, has overthrown the government of the state of Maranhao and that the governor of the state has been imprisoned.
