## PORTO RICO SUGAR CROP.

Under date of December 5th we have advices from Porto Rico to the effect that their sugar crop now beginning delivery will reach 426,622 long tons. This is as against the crop of which the delivery has just been completed, which gives a total yield of 362,619 long tons. The data coming from various sugar factories indicate that the eastern end of the island will have the largest crop on record. As Cuba, Porto Rico and San Domingo lie in about the same latitude, forming the southern boundary of the Caribbean Sea, it becomes somewhat notable that the eastern end of Cuba could have produced as large a crop as it has and also that now the eastern end of Porto Rico is doing the same thing, and later on we may have some returns from Santo Domingo. It is thought that the Guanica Sugar Factory has turned out some 70,000 tons, or about 5,000 tons more than last year.—*Louisiana Planter*, December 27th.
