It is hereby brought to public notice that the Eagle Pencil Company, of New York, N. Y., a corporation organized under the laws of the State of New York, whose trade-mark No. 45756, which was registered in the United States Patent Office, Washington, D. C., on August 29, 1905, was registered in the Office of the Government Secretary of the Virgin Islands of the United States on December 22, 1917, has assigned, to take effect on December 31, 1922, at midnight, its entire right, title and interest in the aforesaid trade-mark, and its other trade-marks, to the Eagle Pencil Company, of New York, N. Y., a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Delaware, (instruments dated December 27, 1922 and August 7, 1923, and recorded April 10, 1923 and October 10, 1923, respectively), and that the said assignment, with respect to the above mentioned trade-mark No. 45756, has this date been recorded in the Office of the Government Secretary of the Virgin Islands of the United States, at St. Thomas, in accordance with the provisions in the regulations governing the registration of patents and trade-marks in the Virgin Islands, approved June 30, 1920.

YOUR NEW POST OFFICE (OPENING TO MORROW.)

The Money Order and Stamp Windows will be opened from 8 a. m. to noon and from 1 p. m. to 5 p. m. regardless of the arrival or dispatching of mails. Service CANNOT be obtained at these windows AFTER 5 p. m.

The General Delivery and Parcel Post Windows will be closed during the noon hour and whenever mails are being distributed.

Ordinarily, the outer doors of the office will be closed 6 p. m.

Do not knock at the Windows when they are closed—IT WILL BE USELESS.

Do not bring your mail to the back of the office (through the yard)—IT WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

If you want to mail sealed parcels of merchandise as Fourth Class matter, let us tell you how it can be done.

See the cards in the stationary mail pans outside of the office for the time these receptacles are emptied.

If there is anything wrong with the Service from your angle, you will not help or remedy it by playing Mark Anthony under the gallery or in the lobby of the office. Tell us your case. We want to know about every case of loss, delay, wrong delivery, or any other improper treatment of mail matter addressed to you or mailed by you. Occasionally, we will stamp your mail:—"Any CONSTRUCTIVE criticism? Tell it to the Postmaster." And we want you to tell us.
