UNDER the authority of Section 227 of the Revenue Act of 1921 a general extension of time has been granted up to and including May 15, 1922 in which to file fiduciary returns, Form 1041, partnership and personal service corporation returns, Form 1065, and information returns covering compensation paid to employees (Forms 1099 and 1096) which may be required to be filed in connection with the fiduciary and partnership and personal service corporation returns. This extension has been granted with respect to the returns above mentioned which are required to be filed for the calendar year 1921 or for any fiscal year ending in 1921.
