PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) in introducing the ordinance said,—Mr. Chairman. In introducing the ordinance before the Council I presume that as it has been sent to the members of the Council a week ago, that every one is familiar with the proposition. I shall briefly relate the history of its creation.

Last year, during the month of May a Committee was appointed by the Governor for the purpose of: (a) making recommendations to the Government as to what improvements, if any, should be undertaken at this time together with the estimated cost of such improvements.

a contractor come over from Porto Rico to investigate the conditions for rebuilding in a modern way, the central road; one of the members of the committee and the Public Works Officer made a trip to Porto Rico and got in contact with one or two contractors, but though these promised to come over here on a visit, they never came. At that time materials were exceedingly expensive and it was thought best to let the project sleep for a while. During the latter part of last year, the Public Works Officer reported that he had got in contact with a contractor in the States who was willing eventually to take the contract for rebuilding the center line road, and on February 4th of this year the Highway Committee held a meeting at which the Public Works Officer was present, and a proposal for financing the reconstruction work was drawn up and submitted to the Government for their consideration.
